

Eastern Shore Housing Committee- October 17th Meeting, 3:00pm-4:30pm Meeting Minutes

I. Welcome and Introduction

- Facilitator: Ahmna Khan, Director of Housing.
- Ahmna welcomed participants, provided an overview of the committee's purpose, and initiated introductions.

II. Guest Speaker 1: Paul Anderson, Senior Housing Specialist, Abilities Network – Housing Support Services Overview

- Paul shared an in-depth overview of the housing support services offered by Abilities Network.
 - Focused on assisting individuals with disabilities to obtain and maintain housing.
 - Emphasized the challenges such as credit history, lack of documentation, and financial readiness.
- Abilities Network operates statewide with a team of five specialists supporting approximately 50 individuals.

- Paul detailed their three-step service delivery model:
 - Assessment of housing needs and financial conditions.
 - Development of individualized housing support plans.
 - Execution and follow-through with tailored strategies.
- Shared recent success stories, such as helping clients secure housing through the DDA Rental Subsidy Program.
- Addressed questions regarding overcoming credit barriers, using resources like My
 Money My Goals and reasonable accommodations.

III. Guest Speaker 2: Don Bibb

Don Bibb was invited but unable to attend.

IV. DHCD Updates: Chelsea Hayman, Deputy Director - Special Populations

- Updates Shared:
 - Revised guidance on the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) for HUDfunded properties.
 - New compliance documents for emergency transfers due to domestic violence.
 - DDA Rental Subsidy Program progress:
 - Eleven participants housed.
 - Eleven actively searching.
 - Two awaiting program authorization.
 - Encouraged stakeholders to direct property owner questions to DHCD for clarification.

V. Mainstream Voucher Updates: Diane Dressler, Consultant

- HUD implemented changes to mainstream voucher regulations in August:
 - Housing authorities can now create separate waitlists for mainstream vouchers.
 - No "live or work" requirement for applicants.
 - Timeframes for voucher usage extended.

- Diane highlighted areas with significant voucher availability, such as Montgomery and St. Mary's Counties.
- Emphasized the importance of understanding portability rules for voucher holders.

VI. Other Member Updates

Advocacy Concerns:

- o Sheri Ewing raised concerns about local officials denying the housing crisis.
 - Suggested increased advocacy at council meetings and sharing personal stories to highlight housing issues.
 - Mentioned the need for better traction within existing housing committees.
- Diane Dressler referenced useful data on cost burdens for renters.

Success Stories:

- Tierra Medley shared updates about legal advocacy for tenants facing unjust pest treatment fees.
 - Collaborated with Shore Legal for pro bono legal assistance.
- Multiple DDA Rental Subsidy Program housing successes were shared, including a client moving into better housing in Silver Spring.

VII. Open Forum

- Discussed strategies to improve advocacy, including attending council meetings and collaborating with affordable housing coalitions.
- Addressed ongoing challenges such as the high cost of rent and limited affordable housing availability.
