In 2025, MIH proudly celebrated its 5th Anniversary as Maryland's statewide leader in ensuring that people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) can live in homes of their own.

This year marked significant milestones:

- 25 Marylanders with IDD moved into homes that have enhanced their quality of life.
- Our Housing Support Services expanded to reach 235 Marylanders statewide, providing the guidance people need to maintain stable, independent living.
- We trained 26 new housing support professionals, bringing our total to more than 120 professionals across 40 agencies, strengthening Maryland's network of housing support specialists.

Since launching in 2020, MIH has helped nearly 50 Marylanders with IDD secure homes that allow them to live with dignity, independence, and connection. Together, we are building a more inclusive Maryland—one where people with disabilities can find and keep the homes of their dreams.

Our 5th Anniversary was celebrated throughout 2025, highlighted by a gathering on September 9 at B.C. Brewery in Hunt Valley, where nearly 100 advocates, supporters, and community leaders came together to honor MIH's impact. The event raised over \$15,000 in sponsorships, reflecting the community's strong commitment to inclusive housing.

FY25 was a year of growth and momentum. As we begin our next chapter, MIH remains dedicated to advancing accessible, affordable, and inclusive housing opportunities across the state. Together, we can create a Maryland where everyone belongs.

Kavita's Bridge to Belonging



Kavita is a determined Rockville woman in her 30s with a developmental disability. With support from Maryland Inclusive Housing (MIH), she secured Housing Support Services that helped her turn a new apartment into a true forever home.

For five years, Kavita lived in a group home that she generally enjoyed, but she faced ongoing challenges. Frequent turnover among staff and roommates created unpredictability, which was difficult for someone who thrives on structure and routine. She knew it was time for something different.

Her Community Services Coordinator connected her with MIH, where she was matched with Community Living Coordinator Tierra Medley. Tierra worked closely with Kavita and her family, helping them engage Makom—a nonprofit that supports and empowers people just like Kavita—ultimately helping her find an affordable apartment in downtown Rockville where she could live independently. Kavita clearly communicated what she needed in an ideal living environment—and her team made it possible.


“She’s so much happier. She’s so much more at home.”

2025 State Legislative Session Advocacy

During the 2025 Maryland Legislative Session, MIH Executive Director Tim Wiens testified before House and Senate committees in support of the proposed FY26 DDA Operating Budget, which includes \$260,000 to support MIH's work.

He also advocated for the DDA Rent Subsidy Program (DDARSP), which helps Marylanders with disabilities rent homes by limiting rent and utilities to 30% of household income. The program is a partnership between DDA, MDOD, and DHCD.

Baltimore County Housing Committee

With the support of Del. Jennifer White Holland, MIH launched its sixth housing committee in Baltimore County—quickly becoming one of the organization's strongest since its start in January. Chaired by former MIH Director of Housing Sharonda Huffman, the committee includes more than 20 disability advocates as well as local and state officials. The group focuses on addressing affordable housing challenges and helping people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) find homes that meet their needs.

Howard County Housing Justice Efforts

MIH received a \$10,000 Horizon Foundation grant to advance housing justice in Howard County. Beginning in January, MIH Community Living Coordinator Sarah Hochbaum and Director of Housing Ahmna Khan have participated in grantee sessions on housing priorities and advocacy, collaborating with local nonprofits to address shared barriers.

Prince George's County Executive Race

In the spring, MIH surveyed County Executive candidates on their housing priorities for residents with disabilities. Responses were shared on MIH's website, social media, and with partners. Aisha Braveboy, Esq. (D) was elected County Executive in June, and her supportive responses set the stage for future collaboration with MIH.
